## HIGHLIGHTS AND MAJOR ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

- Met over the summer with executives to interview students for the Director of Student Advocacy position
- Attended the UCLA vigil service over the summer with the EVP and IVP to speak a few words in order to provide solidarity and show UC Merced support
- Held 1:1 meetings with any incoming new senator or executive available during the summer to discuss their positions and goals for the year






**Chart 1: August Monthly Report Office Traffic**
