- Had lunch with Dr. Hong, a speaker and brought up student issues in addition to discussing the topic of data analysis and student feedback, especially how students often feel ignored when administrators make decisions without student input

Internal Vice President

- Met with senators to discuss how to run effective meetings
- Working with the Secretary to compile a more effective attendance record
- Had money moved into his budget under the Line Item for Student Leadership and Civic Engagement to fund two students to present research in Cuba
- Funded the first UC Merced students to go to Cuba
- Working on the retreat scheduled for Martin Luther King Jr. weekend, *In progress*

External Vice President

- Organized Voter Registration Week which included events such as 'Your choice, your vote,' and the Debate watch party
- Tabled for voter registration, trying to get students to register to vote before the deadline and educating students on the importance of voting

- Organized, along with other External office members and ASUCM members, a Dorm Storm to get students living on campus registered to vote
- Planning the Regents Meeting trip, *In progress*
- Planning and attending the Students of Color Conference (SOCC), *In* progress

- Currently working on the budget call process
- Tabling to gather student feedback in order to bring a new service or program to UC Merced

Director of Academic Affairs

- Collaborated with another Housing and Residence Life Resident Assistant (RA) to provide scantrons for their study programs
- Met with HEORES Stress Lead Intern Nia Jones weekly and finalized the Review Week (Dead Week) interest form – will release during Fall 2016 Finals time after Thanksgiving – and have began drafting a proposal for the Undergraduate Council (UGC) for consideration
- Hosted Fall 2016's 1st FURS Application Information Session and informed students how to apply to FURS and what the program entails. Scheduled one more for Fall 2016 and will schedule two more for Spring 2017 once booking reservations are available
- Had a one on one Steve Lerer to update him on progress being made with some projects and received advice on how to move further and strengthen some of the possible actions
- Met with the University Librarian Haipeng Li and Library staff to discuss the student concern of raising noise levels and how to engage that so the Library can be a study space for all students
- Came down to the conclusion that Library will put up signs around 2nd 4th floors for quiet study space and the Library and ASUCM will release an announcement detailing students to check their own peers; noise levels. In addition, the library will be hiring a social media coordinator in spring (January) that will assist with this initiative. KL 355 is also being converted to a quiet study space
- Collaborating with DARTS who will be reserving quiet study spaces
- Discussed Open Education Resources with the Librarian, which would be faculty writing their own books or using free, accessible e-books online so students attain textbooks or alternatives free of cost
- Met with Vice Provost and Dean for Undergraduate Education Elizabeth Whitt to discuss Chorale Director position available that will take the place of music courses not offered anymore, Writing center, Math lab, UCOP campaign for advertising 1st generation faculty, etc.

- Met with Undergraduate Research Journal Treasurer Maril Cruz to detail URL on how to establish by-laws so that URJ could become a service under ASUCM rather than a make-shift RCO under the DoAA's line item budget
- Proceeded with many of URK purchase requests for informational events
- Met with UGC Student Representative Brenda Gutierrez to discuss individual and collective goals for UGC's platform and how to navigate space together
- Was invited to UCI's initiative of a UC-Wide collaboration
- Met with Regent Perez for both an ASUCM and LGBTQ+ student meeting times to discuss student issues and possible resolutions for our campus

Director of Student Activities

- Met with Business Society for the Haunted House to help with funding and event logistics in hosting a fair
- Met with Earth Club to attain funding
- Met with Rotoract to discuss an increased budget
- Working with the Student Activities Committee on hosting a Tailgate event for senior night basketball in February, figuring out the details but are hoping to host in front of the gym with food vendors, dancing, and smaller activities, *In Progress*

- Attended the 4th Annual Central Valley Leadership Summit where he was able to be apart of a panel discussion where leaders from the UC, CSU's, Community Colleges and Private Universities in the Central Valley Coalition to solve some of the issues that affect our region (i.g. mental health and health services)
- Attended the Student Labor Organizing Conference with the EVP, where they learned about organizing and advocacy
- Collaborated with CARE and ASUCM in the CARE #HealthyRelationshipGoals Campaign to inform students about what a healthy relationship consists of through a photo campaign, *In Progress*
- Sexual Assault Prevention Training with the CARE office to educate ASUCM members about the issues in regards to sexual assault topics and resources on out campus November 5th at 12-4pm in the Bobcat Lair, *In Progress*
- Collaborated with the Native American Student Coalition to draft a resolution that calls for the opposition to the Dakota Access Pipeline and stands in solidarity with the water protectors defending their sacred land, *In Progress*
- Cosponsored the event where we will be welcoming the Caravan Against Repression in Mexico at UC Merced on November 6th, *In Progress*

- Collaborating with his staff to reach out to Multicultural Organizations/Clubs on campus to educate them about the resources offered by ASUCM, *In progress*

- Met with Brenda Maldonado-Rosas, the Manager and Lead Adviser of SSHA Advising, and discussed the common opinion SSHA students had about the services advising provided and discussed different routes that could be taken to remedy student complaints. Was able to provide ideas that will improve the relationship and overall image students have of SSHA advising
