Funding American Medical Student Association for a Hospital Medicine Program Abroad

The bill will sponsor AMSA's CFHI Committee to participate in a 2-week intensive Hospital Medicine Program located in Cordoba, Argentina.

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BACKGROUND

The American Medical Student Association (AMSA) at UC Merced is an all-encompassing organization, open to students interested in pursuing a career in the health professions, including but not limited to, medicine, nursing, or physician assistant. AMSA members work toward academic success, community outreach, health advocacy, and, ultimately, personal and professional development.

Child Family Health International (CFHI) is a non-profit organization that has been around for over 20 years working towards improving access to global health. CFHI, an official partner of AMSA, provides AMSA members with numerous amounts of special access to programs, scholarships, and discounts. Its purpose is to provide global health electives and practicums through 31 community-based Global Health Education Programs in 10 Latin American countries. CFHI sets and practices standards for educational rigor, supervision, ethics, competency-based education, safety and reciprocity. Students who participate in CFHI programs are exposed to the complexity of health and wellness in other parts of the world, people of different cultural backgrounds, poverty, resiliency, geopolitics, historical contexts, social differences, and an insight of how other health professionals treat diseases. Most importantly, CFHI aims to connect individuals with health professionals, while also helping them understand the importance of global health, equity, and social justice.

CFHI's Global Health Intensive Program in Argentina provides exposure to hospital medicine through clinical rotations at some of the oldest and most renowned teaching hospitals in Latin America. Participants gain exposure to government programs serving uninsured patients, while also being placed in hospitals that focus on infectious diseases, pediatrics, research, tertiary care, maternity, and emergency medicine. In addition, students participate in case studies, discussions, and lectures alongside local health professionals and medical students. Finally, students are given the opportunity to immerse themselves in the Argentinian culture by attending Spanish classes and day trips.

PURPOSE

To be funded \$9,720 from the Associated Students of the University of California, Merced in order for a group of six AMSA members to participate in CFHI's Hospital Medicine two-week intensive program located in Latin America, Cordoba, Argentina. The program will occur during the 2016 winter break. The anticipated program start date is December 24th.

- 1. <u>Whereas</u>: The Preamble of the Constitution of the Associated Students of the University of California, Merced communicates that ASUCM "promotes the general educational welfare and enhancement of the academic benefits and opportunities offered for the continued success of the students of the University of California, Merced"; and,
- 2. <u>Whereas</u>: The Associated Students of the University of California, Merced exists to provide for the UC Merced student body in all aspects necessary to create a well-balanced educational experience; and,
- 3. <u>Whereas</u>: The Child Family Health International Committee, under the UC Merced chapter of the American Medical Student Association participate in the hospital medicine program in Argentina to allow our students to represent UC Merced and our community abroad; and,
- 4. <u>Whereas</u>: Attending the CFHI program will enable students to network and gain experience in the health field of a Latin American country; and,
- 5. <u>Whereas</u>: This trip will offer unique opportunities for these individuals to gain invaluable skills, knowledge, and experience that will optimize their candidacies in health-related professions after graduating from UC Merced; and,
- 6. <u>Whereas</u>: This program will last for two-weeks during the winter, giving our students an opportunity to spend their school break undertaking a program that will give them insight on their future careers; and,
- 7. <u>Whereas</u>: The Hospital Medicine in Latin America budget breakdown and sample schedule of the program can be found in the Appendixes A and B; and,

Be it Enacted: ASUCM Senate will allocate between \$9,720 from their 2016-2017 funds to support CFHI's participation in Argentina's two-week intensive hospital medicine program.
