First off, I have relayed to the Student Advocacy Committee the information given to me in my meeting with the concerned student parent, Katie. She brought up a lot of good points, and I believe that the information she shared with me is valuable in bringing to light an issue that affects a group of students on our campus. I have suggested to the Student Advocacy committee to put together a survey to gauge the opinion of student parents on our campus, but perhaps a focus group might be better. I do hope to see through research in the future, and hopefully an ASUCM Resolution.

Secondly, I finally met with Kari and Alyssa, along with Senator Fitzgerald, last Thursday. Kari and Alyssa both work in the Violence Prevention Programs. I learned a lot from this meeting and we're really excited to collaborate for National Campus Conversation week. We've decided to go with a World Cafe format where students will move from table to table speaking to staff/professionals about awareness, and resources. I believe this event will work out great because they have personal contacts that are well versed in this topic. This will help educate students on the resources they have available because apparently the biggest issue they see at the moment is the lack of clear communication on who to report to, so we're hoping this clarifies any inconsistencies. I've asked Senator Fitzgerald to motion to create an ad-hoc committee within Senate, so that we have a group of dedicated students who can meet every week to plan for the event. The Undergraduate Experience committee is charged with making recommendations to the Chancellor and Senior Level Admin to discuss what the undergraduate body will look like in 2020, and what resources need to be in place to make undergraduate experience great.
